In October 2017, the **6th annual DKFZ PostDoc retreat** organized by the PostDoc Network took place at the Herz-Jesu-Kloster in Neustadt. During the two day event, PostDocs from the DKFZ, NCT, DKTK and ZMBH presented their scientific research in talks and poster sessions. The combination of scientific and social program allowed to not only talk about science and projects but also to chat about work and life balance and PostDocs' life in Heidelberg in general.

Our invited speakers on scientific publishing and careers gave personal accounts of and advice to participants from their own experience. Nina Cabezas-Wallscheid, a former DKFZ Postdoc and since May 2017 Group Leader at the Max Planck Institute in Freiburg, spoke about her path to become an independent researcher. She shared some tips and personal views about this exciting period of creating her own lab. Maria Papatriantafyllou gave an insight into how to prepare a good manuscript and additionally talked about how her daily life as an editor is. Barbara Janssens used her interactive workshop to strengthen the importance of career development and to introduce the newly funded Helmholtz Career Development Center for Researchers at the DKFZ.

Career Day: Research & Development

On **Dec 8th 2017** DKFZ hosted the second Career Day on the topic of **Research & Development**. With around 350 participants a new record was reached. Mainly PhD students and PostDocs took the chance to inform themselves about possible career options in R&D outside from academia. Twelve speakers, all of them DKFZ Alumni, shared their personal experiences about their transition from academia to industry and gave insights in their current position and company. Four main sessions covered research in Biotech and Pharma, as well as Development and R&D associated career paths.

The talks were followed by intensive round table discussions with the speakers, which offered the great chance for participants to ask more detailed and personal questions and to extend their network. Interestingly, several of the invited speakers emphasized how active networking during their time at the DKFZ was helpful for their career. For instance, they were dedicated to the **PDN network** and BioContact or had organized a career day themselves.



The day before the career day some attendees already seized the chance to join one of the two satellite workshops. The external trainers highlighted how to specifically match their CVs to preselected job postings in industry and to tailor your application to an industry setting. On top, at the career day the participants got the opportunity to finalize their CVs with a picture taken by a professional photographer and take their chance to apply to one of the positions advertised at the job board.

According to the positive feedback from participants and speakers the R&D Career Day 2017 was a really fruitful event, providing valuable information and a great platform to network. On behalf of the organizing team, we would like to thank all people who helped to make this career day a success.

Postdoc survey 2017




Your answers and feedback are very much appreciated and will be directly used to evaluate existing activities and to shape the future support network for all Postdocs at the institute.


In the meantime the Postdoc Program kindly shared with us some interesting statistics that we will keep posting in the next issues. Stay tuned!

N=217




PhD obtained in




Total=192

Career Paths of DKFZ Alumni



Oana Toader, PhD – Post Doc at Boehringer Ingelheim, Pharmaceuticals, Biberach an der Riss, Germany

Research background:

"I am an electrophysiologist with experience in measuring electrical activity from individual cells in culture, brain slices and behaving rodents. I studied biochemistry at the University of Bucharest, in Romania. During my bachelor's studies I worked in the neurophysiology lab, on molecular models of pain. After that, I was part of the

International Max Planck Research School of Neurosciences in Goettingen, which was a great entry point into the international neuroscience community. After attending the courses of the graduate program in Goettingen, I performed the experiments for my Master's thesis in the Neuroscience and Brain Technologies Department at the Italian Institute of Technology in Genova, Italy, where I learned patch-clamping in brain slices (and Italian). In Genova I investigated neuronal excitability in a mouse model for epilepsy. During my PhD in Heidelberg at the DKFZ, I specialized in in vivo electrophysiology combined with optogenetics and complex data analysis."

What is your current position and what do you like about it?

"Since April 2017 I hold a PostDoc position in the Central Nervous Systems Disease Research Department at Boehringer Ingelheim, in Biberach an der Riss. From my position I can access resources that are not available to most labs in the academia. These consist of financial means, as well as core facilities and expert scientists from other fields. I get to work with people who have the expertise I lack and who are very motivated to help out. Whereas during my PhD I developed a lot on the scientific side, now I am learning much about communication and organization and I get to apply my scientific knowledge for translational projects. As a plus, with my boss I can openly talk about future career options. He is very supportive and provides me with information that I don't directly have access to. Last but not least, I get to do science without the added pressure of having to publish in a high impact journal. Instead, our goal is to get the results out there, be it in a technical or specialized journal."

What skills have been useful in obtaining your new job?

"The most important thing for obtaining my job was my scientific expertise. Of course I was not the only one with a CV matching the job requirements, but I think in the interview I was able to convince my future boss and our close collaborators that I can work independently and at the same time communicate efficiently with others who have different backgrounds. Now I see that no one expects me to do everything, but it is expected from me to be the driver of this specific project and get the appropriate people involved if and when necessary. Speaking German is also something that is highly appreciated, but not necessary."



Christian Breunig, PhD -Group Leader at Heidelberg Pharma Research GmbH, Ladenburg, Germany

Research background:

"After my studies in Biotechnology in Medicine in London, Molecular Biotechnology in Heidelberg and Molecular Medicine in Berlin I started with a classical academic career doing a PhD in the Immunomonitoring Group at the DKFZ / NCT. Afterwards I spend around 4 ½ years as being a PostDoc at Hannover Medical School and in the division of Molecular Genome Analysis at DKFZ combining the field of immunology with breast cancer and miRNAs. Since April 2016 I am a group leader at Heidelberg Pharma."

What is your current position and what do you like about it?

"At Heidelberg Pharma Research GmbH I am currently group leader for Biomarker & Cell Biology. My job at Heidelberg Pharma is diverse. Typical tasks at my current position are e.g. planning of projects; instruction and support of technical employees; evaluation of experimental data; from time to time lab work; literature search; meetings with colleagues and collaboration partners to discuss projects; administration. I really enjoy working at Heidelberg Pharma especially with its good working environment where I can still do scientific work. Moreover, I enjoy bringing in my expertise and ideas to push and influence projects."

What skills have been useful in obtaining your new job?

"During my PhD and especially during my PostDoc time at DKFZ I obtained a broad knowledge of cancer research as well as acquired expertise in a broad spectrum of methods. In my current position, this helps me to come up with new project ideas, plan experiments and develop new assays. Communication, supervising technical staff and networking is important at my current position. During my PhD / PostDoc time I strengthened these skills by presenting posters or giving talks during meetings or conferences, supervising students and technical staff, being part of the PDN community at DKFZ as well as organizing events like the Career Day."

➤ **Short term research visits for Postdocs**

DKFZ fosters international collaborations and the acquisition of new research techniques. Along this line, DKFZ offers funding opportunities for short-term research visits for Postdocs. Visits may last between 1 and 3 months and should serve a well-defined scientific goal. Participating Postdocs may receive travel costs up to €350.- within Europe and €750.- outside of Europe. Housing may be supported with up to €400.- per month.

To benefit from a short term research visit, Postdocs are requested to apply for an **external training** in the **HCM portal**, using the title “**Short term research visit**”. A brief and informative description of the purpose of the visit should be given, as well a list of estimated costs to be covered. Department heads/supervisors will be required to supply a brief letter of support. The advanced training board (Weiterbildungsausschuss) will review all applications in their monthly meeting.

➤ **Train and Gain for Postdocs**

Would you like to have hands-on support for your research project? Would you also like to advance your trainer and leadership skills? Then joining the **Train and Gain Program** might be an option for you.

In the frame of this program you will supervise one of the 60 research technician trainees/Azubi-Biologielaborant and thereby get hands-on support for your project. As a preparation for your role as supervisor, you will be provided with all necessary information as well as the possibility for supportive advice or coaching.

Background information: At DKFZ, in total 120 young apprentices are being trained. Of these approx. 60 are trained to become future research technicians. Besides a solid theoretical training, these apprentices receive hands-on training in research labs working under supervision. Thereby apprentices have the opportunity to contribute directly to research projects. Please note that many of our apprentices are proficient in English. In their third year of training, many apprentices have in addition gathered up to 3 months of work experiences in labs across Europe.


Career Center for Postdocs Training

Since October 2017 DKFZ started to build a Helmholtz **Career Center** for Postdocs, thanks to funding from the "Helmholtz Initiative and Networking Fund" to which DKFZ, HMGU and FZJ successfully applied. This "Helmholtz Career Development Center for Researchers" will focus on career guidance for **Postdocs** and is funded for an initial 3 years (with a possible continuation up to 5 years). It will be an extension of the already existing PhD Career Service, which offers one-to-one career guidance, trainings and career network. In close cooperation with the PDN, the DKFZ Postdoc Program and Advanced Training, the new Career Center will support you in creating and managing your personal **career development plan** supported by a competence **assessment software**. [Sabine Schuler-Hofmann](#) just joined our Career Service team to set up this system and is available for "CDP Guidance Appointments" (careeradvice.youcanbook.me) alternating with Barbara on Tuesdays in TP4. The self-assessment of skills and interests will help to define career options and appropriate trainings within the postdoctoral career development portfolio, which is based on career paths taken by DKFZ Alumni in academia and beyond. There will also be a dedicated **mentoring programme** so you can benefit more from our Career Network on www.dkfz-connect.de. Last but not least, based on your requests and feedback, the Career Center will also aim at more actively involving your supervisors in the process of career development.



interaction between you and Paul – especially during the Q&A session. Questions for Paul addressed many different topics, such as:

- How can you keep your personal work-life balance while becoming the head of a research group?
- Is it possible to gain leadership experience already at the postdoc stage – how?
- What can you do to raise your own profile and achieve visibility in your field?
- When is the best time point to start applying for group leader positions?
- Which strategies have proven successful to recruit co-workers to your own lab?
